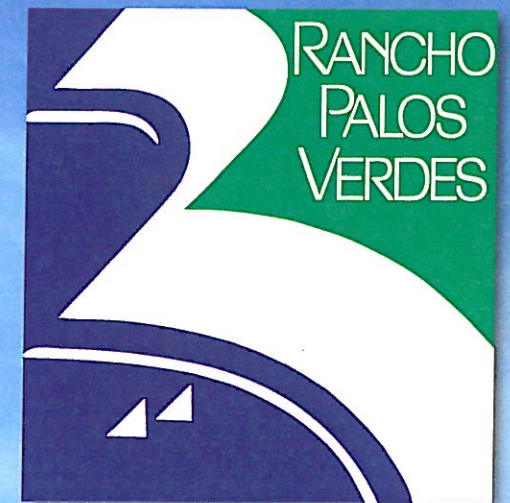

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT



The Rancho Palos Verdes Public Works Department is responsible for a wide variety of activities, programs, projects, capital improvements, and maintenance throughout the City.

Public Right of Way (PROW)

Including sidewalks, streets, landscaped parkways, driveway aprons, curbs, gutters, bikeways, medians, and trails.

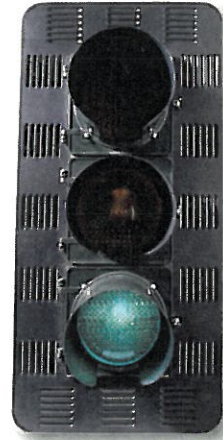
Street & Pavement Management

Including design, construction management, and inspection of arterial and residential street resurfacing projects, roadway striping, bus stops, ADA access ramps, medians, and signs.



Traffic Engineering

Assisting the Traffic Safety Commission, administering the neighborhood traffic calming and vehicle parking programs, performing speed zone surveys, designing traffic signals/signs, and reviewing new development plan right of way impacts and temporary traffic control plans.



City Facilities

Including Upper Point Vicente Park (City Hall), Abalone Cove Beach and Shoreline Park, Del Cerro Park, Eastview Park, Founders Park, Fred Hesse Community Park, Grandview Park, Ladera Linda Community Center, Marilyn Ryan Sunset Point Park, Robert E. Ryan Community Park, Point Vicente Interpretive Center, Vanderlip Park, and other small passive parks.

Maintenance

Including City buildings, parks (grounds, playground equipment, picnic areas, irrigation systems), trails, open space, roadways, sidewalks, traffic signals/signs, sewers, and stormwater drainage systems.

Water Quality & Flood Protection

Including maintenance and rehabilitation of the existing collection systems and the management of stormwater through flood protection infrastructure and stormwater quality compliance with state and federal regulations.

Sanitary Sewer System

Including coordination of state and federal mandates and overall management of sewage collection system assets.

Landslide Administration & Management

Including road/land stabilization and repairs, GPS monitoring of land movement, and de-watering well activity.

Public Works Administration

Including public service requests, permit processing, solid waste and recycling programs, grant management, budget preparation, and the Home Improvement Program.
