None of the above numbers includes tournaments, estimated at 9,000 meals. That is many meals. It is a big challenge to keep the quality up and keep everybody happy or at least satisfied.

Most of the responsibility for meeting the challenge falls on Martial Perrin, our Clubhouse Manager. It is no accident that Martial performs at a very high level. He gives credit to his outstanding staff. It does take a team to succeed.

Martial was born in Paris, 1947 into a family of chefs. The family moved from Paris to Iran in 1952, where his father was Executive Chef of the Royal Family. He graduated from Saint Louis French High School and moved back to Paris to start studies at the University of Sorbonne. He was a professional jazz drummer working nights to pay his way through college.

After graduation, he went back to Iran and worked for the Royal Family for seven years. He was Manager at three hotels, including the Hotel Evin, Tehran, and the Hotel Zibakenar, Caspian Sea.

In 1976, he moved back to Paris and became Manager of the Nikko Hotel. In 1978, he moved to the Intercontinental Hotel, Paris as the night Manager for two years. In 1980, he came to the United States. He worked a few different jobs until 1983, when he started working at South Hills Country Club in West Covina. He worked at South Hills Country Club for ten years, as Assistant Manager for 1-1/2 years and as Club Manager for eight & half years. On July 1, 1993, out of 100 applicants, he was hired as Club Manager for Palos Verdes Golf Club. Here is a summary of his education and honors:

TURF TALK BY PAT GRADOVILLE

The golf course maintenance staff has been busy around the course. The landscape beautification project is taking shape. Nearly all of the plants have been installed, most by our own people after their normal workday. We have a committed group of employees who have gone the extra mile in our goal of making Palos Verdes Golf Club one of the premier clubs in Southern California. The lake project added a much-needed facelift to the 7th hole, and the landscape beautification uses many of the same plants. All of the landscape beds will be mulched using wood chips following 45-60 days of observation to make sure none of the old plant material grows back. Look for updates outside the bag room for more details.

Elsewhere around the course, we have been busy *Verticutting* the roughs to reduce thatch that has been accumulating. In some of the thicker areas, you can expect to see some scalping as a result of excessive removal of dense turfgrass. This is common in Kikuyugrass, especially during the summer months. The uniform distribution of the new irrigation system is definitely paying dividends, as the course is consistent throughout.

A member approached me with a suggestion the other day. He asked that I pass along a tip, asking players to kick the sand off their shoes after they exit a bunker, thereby keeping the sand in the rough instead of tracking it across the green. Thanks for the tip, Dick!

Finally, we will be unveiling a new program that will improve the condition of our greens. Watch for more details in the following weeks.

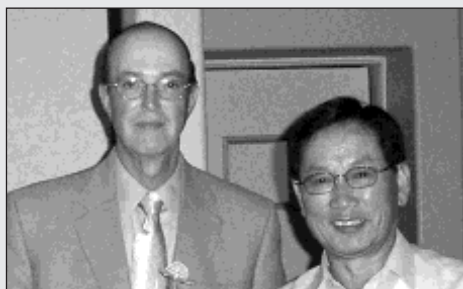

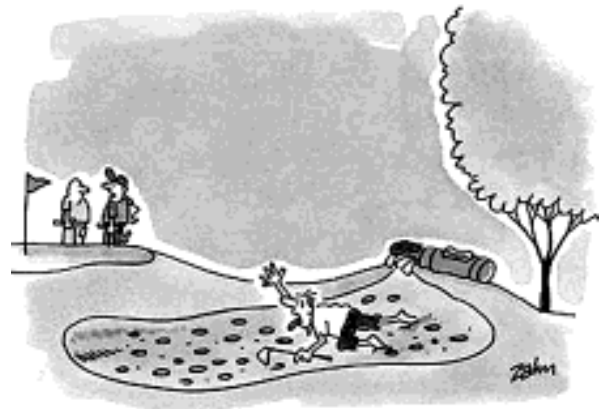


