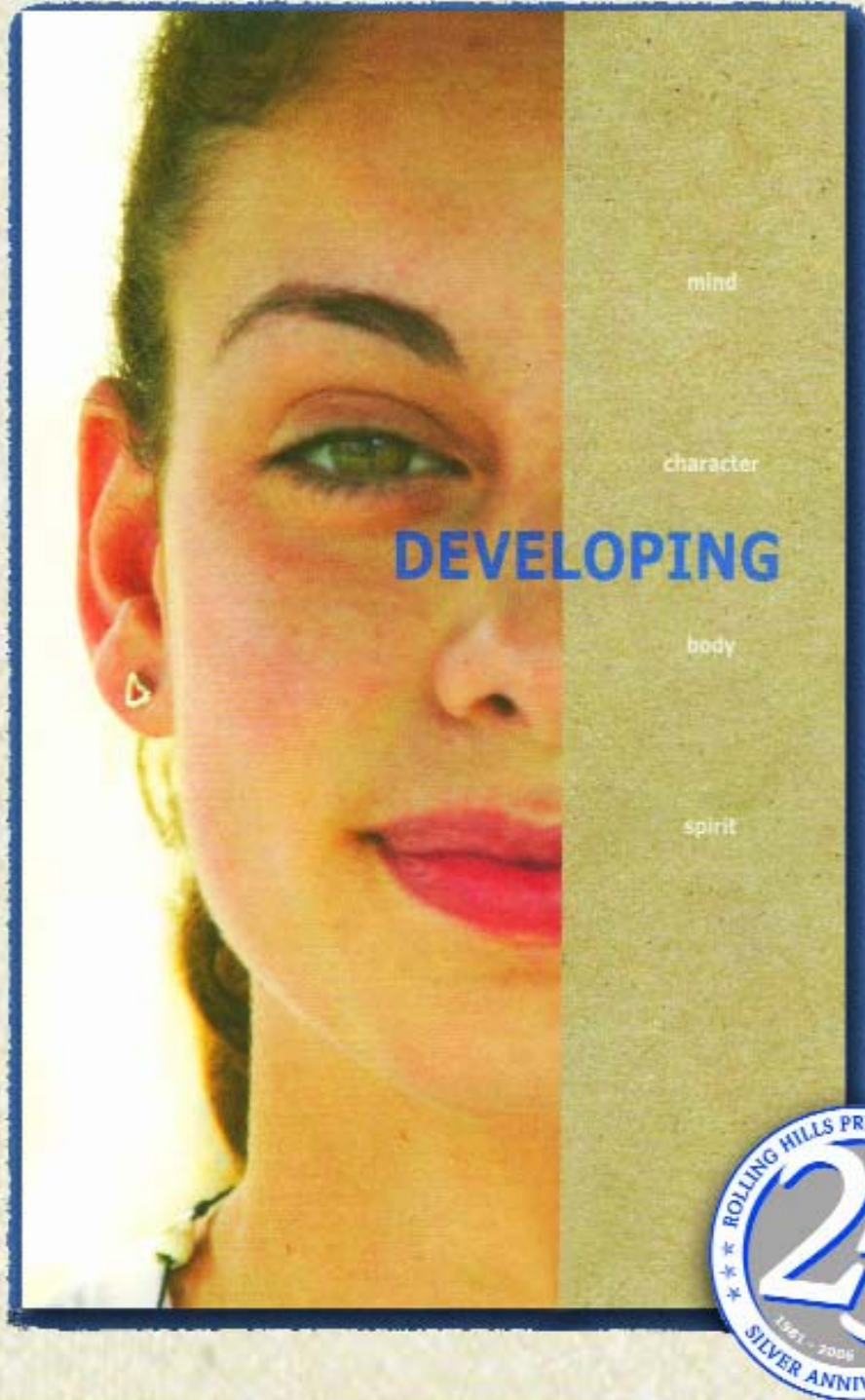

# HEAD OF SCHOOL

I was chatting with another school head last year when I chaired his school's WASC Visiting Committee, and he articulated something that had been floating around in my mind for while. Our conversation was about classrooms and schools being "teacher-centered" or "student-centered" and he contended that the best phrase to capture what a good school should be is "relationship-centered." I realized I'd been grasping for that phrase myself for a while.

I have long felt that one of the great strengths of RHP is the quality of the relationships we work so hard to create between and among adults and students. At June's end-of-year meeting I asked faculty to reflect on and share some of the year's "RHP moments." The stories were replete with students suddenly "getting" difficult academic concepts, bench players stepping up to inspire their teammates to improbable victory, formerly hesitant singers bringing down the house with their confident voices, and students overcoming fears on outdoor education trips. But one theme that ran through many of the stories was the quality of the relationships on campus.

Gayle Taylor wrote: "Last week, when a group of three students . . . presented Countee Cullen's magnificent poem, "Any Human to Another," the reading, interpretation and subsequent analysis were entertaining, insightful, and full of reminders why we need to try to understand and accept each other. I think this is one of the messages that RHP succeeds in giving its students. I love the diversity of race, talents, and interests at this school." And Jennifer Blackburn spoke about watching her AP Physics students struggling to derive the equation,  $E=MC^2$  and seeing the disbelief and joy in their faces when they realized they had done it. Wendy Moffat wrote about her experience, six years ago, of working with then-seventh-grader Angelica Iannitti on her outdoor education trip, and of being so immensely impressed with now Student President Angelica on this year's trip to Europe: "The camaraderie and genuine concern of all the students and faculty on the trip has brought home to me that RHP is truly a family."

I think good schools have long realized that we cannot be completely "teacher-centered," with the academic simply standing at the front of class, spouting wisdom for the youngsters to passively absorb. But "student-centered" risks the excesses of the "me generation" dominating schools: too far a swing of the pendulum in my mind. "Relationship-centered" is a much better guideline because it implies the full and active participation of all parties.

One way to look at our work here as teachers is to consider it as developing relationships between and among people. Students will learn better if they feel comfortable and confident in a particular teacher's classroom, and they will learn better if they actively work at getting on with their classmates. Small schools are able to teach these skills in relationship building, and students are forced to learn the skills. In a large school students can just join their preferred cliques and avoid having to get on with others they may not like, which is not very good preparation for the relationship-building we must all continually perform in our professional and personal lives. But it's not just about relationships between people: a teacher's job is also to ensure a student develops a strong relationship with the academic content. This is one reason that we hire teachers who love their disciplines. They work hard not just to "teach the content," but to transmit that passion for their subjects, so that students don't just memorize but understand (Mr. Farzin's math mantra). RHP teachers force their students to question, to analyze, to make connections, to dig deeper; in other words, to form a working relationship with the curriculum.

And our students understand the value of a relationship-centered school too. Tristan Smith, '05, wrote the following note to one of his teachers before he graduated last June: "As a student, I was never perfect. There were days when I might have talked too much and days when I might not have worked as hard as usual. Nonetheless, as a teacher, you would always give me the encouragement I needed to progress. And I believe you began to understand how hard I did work in your class and how much pride I take in my writing. I felt I developed a great chemistry with you as a student and a person, and that's the main reason I learned so much from you. You made me confident in my writing ability and I deeply appreciate you for that."

On March 1, 2005 RHP/Renaissance was honored to receive the largest donation in its history. A current family who wishes to remain anonymous stepped forward to challenge the parents, alums and friends of the school to raise \$3 million toward the building of the new campus. The Capital Executive Committee accepted their challenge to match \$3 million in raised funds over the period beginning March 1 and ending June 30, 2005. All dollars raised during that time would be matched in cash dollar for dollar up to \$3 million!

The Capital Campaign Committee and the Development Office quickly developed a plan to solicit every current family, alum family, grandparent and friend. Many foundations and corporations whose interests lie in green building and bricks and mortar were also contacted about this incredible opportunity to make a matching gift to build a new campus for RHP/Renaissance. I congratulate Kevin Hunter and all members of the Capital Campaign Committee as well as the parents and friends of RHP and Renaissance for raising \$1.1 million! I want to thank our anonymous donor family for their very generous challenge and to announce that they have agreed to extend their pledge so that the schools can receive the full benefit of their matching challenge. At this time I also wish to congratulate the faculty and administration for keeping the mission of Rolling Hills Prep School on track. We have just completed our 24th year with many successes in the classroom, in the studio, on stage and on the fields which have led to graduating thirty-seven students in the class of 2005 who are now headed off to their college or university of choice.

On August 4, 2004 RHP/Renaissance received title to the 20+ acres of land that will become its long awaited permanent campus. We on the board celebrated with the administration on a job well done! However, as with most construction projects of this magnitude, the challenges did not stop because we now owned the land! Congresswoman Jane Harman and her staff have continued to support RHP in its efforts with the Department of Education and the Navy to resolve the many issues regarding the land transfer. We hope to soon announce the timeline for relocating to our permanent home.

On behalf of the RHP/Renaissance Board of Trustees I want to thank you for the many ways in which you support our schools. We hope that you will join us in looking forward to a new year that will lead us to celebrate 25 years of preparing South Bay students for college and, hopefully, a new permanent campus that will become "a home of our own."

## A Home of Our Own

During the past 8 years the RHP Board of Trustees and Administration have been involved in securing the land to build a new campus for our small school. As you will have seen from earlier articles in this report, RHP received title to 20 acres of land on Palos Verdes Drive North on August 4, 2004. While much of the pre-construction work had been put in place for the new campus prior to transfer of the land, there were still many things that could not be addressed until the school actually had title to the land.

We are pleased to report that the entitlement process with the city of Los Angeles is complete and approved. RHP has approval to build out a Pre-K to 12 campus for up to 900 students. The School has also been approved to operate a sixty-two unit faculty village for RHP staff, artists, musicians and writers in residence.

Four years ago the Campus Transition Committee completed an exhaustive study of many areas of concern regarding moving a school to a new campus such as emergency preparedness, emergency services, environmental issues and hazardous materials. Recently a fault rupture hazard investigation was also completed on the upper campus and we are pleased to report that there are no earthquake faults on or adjacent to our building site.

Receiving title to the land was the first of many hurdles to be cleared to reach the goal of a new campus. The federal transfer of the land to RHP is a complex bureaucratic process. While it has been frustrating and the financing requirements for the project are unusual, we continue to work with Congresswoman Jane Harman and other federal officials to resolve the financing issues that have delayed getting the campus construction started.

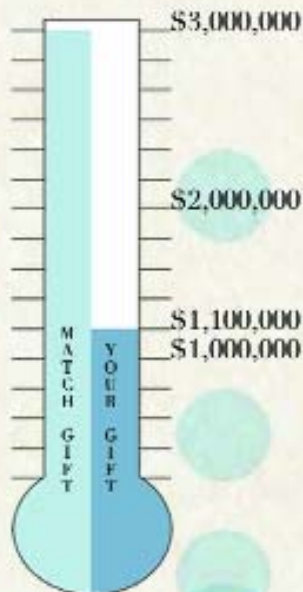
Original planning included construction requirements that will make the campus a LEED Certified facility. RHP has already demonstrated its commitment to the environment, green building and the community by allowing Habitat for Humanity to recycle more than 50 tons of windows, doors, appliances and hardware from the houses on the upper campus that were scheduled for removal. The asphalt shingles are being stripped and ground up for recycling. The plywood and rafters which are mostly prefabricated are also headed for reuse and recycling. When only the concrete pads, driveways and sidewalks are remaining, those too will be ground up and be turned into new concrete for the new campus!

The development process has been arduous and we are not complacent enough to think that the challenges have all been met. However, it continues to be the plan of the RHP Board of Trustees to secure funding and relocate the campus to 1500 Palos Verdes Drive North, Los Angeles as soon as we possibly can.

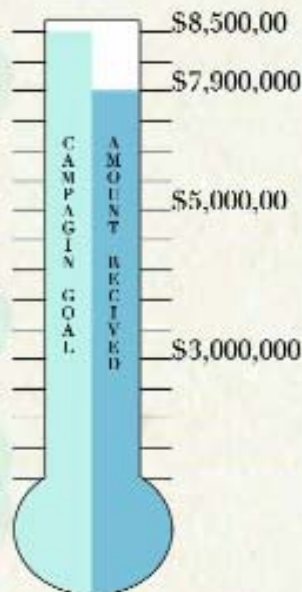

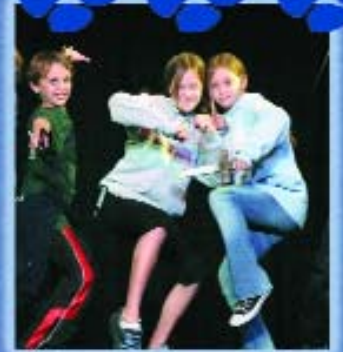
The Marilyn Harper Endowment honors another much-loved teacher who helped found RHP. Funds from this endowment support the humanities at RHP.
