ANNUAL REPORT



From The Head of School

February 6, 2007 . . . Now there's a date that will long be remembered as pivotal in RHP's history. On that Tuesday morning I got up early and arrived at around 7:00 a.m. for the school's first day on its permanent campus. Thick mist enveloped the parking lot, "a peasouper" it would have been called in England. With coffee in hand, and bundled up in a Red Sox jacket, I waited and watched.

First, teachers began to arrive, hurrying out of their cars to their new classrooms. Then students began appearing—junior Michelle Altman was the first to step on campus that day—and by 8:00 a.m. streams of them emerged from the mist. Excited chatter filled the air.

Slowly during the morning, the soup lifted to reveal a sparkling, sunswept campus. As the mist dissipated, so did the burden of uncertainty we have endured for the past nine years. I believe I actually felt that burden float off of my shoulders. The day sped past. By 6:00 p.m. everyone had gone home and the sun was setting behind the green hills of Palos Verdes. I toasted the day alone in the empty parking lot, finally acknowledging the reality of this school's dream come true: we are on our own campus and no one can ever take that away from us! No more wondering if a landlord will let us stay; no more forced sharing with schools with different missions; no more uncertainty.

Why were we so successful despite the tortuous journey? Because our school is supported by so many *True Believers*. How important was fundraising in our success? Absolutely critical! When a youngish school like ours sets out to build a \$15 million campus from scratch, two fundraising trendlines have to be developed: generous capital campaign giving and all-encompassing annual fund giving. And we succeeded in both, raising over \$8 million in capital funds and recording 100% participation in annual fund from trustees, faculty and enrolled families in four out of the last six years. It was this latter record that helped give Bank of America the confidence to loan us \$7 million to complete Phase I of the project. (Well, almost complete it . . . as I

write we are still looking for the funds to install the traffic light and add shade structures, but I'm confident we will have them completed before too long.)

On behalf of the trustees, teachers and students (past, present and future), I send to you, our many *True Believers*, my heartfelt thanks, not only for February 6, 2007, but for every day to come that we will benefit from the ability to pursue our educational mission in our own home.

Now on to Phase 2!

From The Assistant Head of School

When I hear this (and I hear it a lot) it says to me that we are doing our job - which is to give your child a well rounded education.

This has been a challenging year at RHP, with all the changes we have been through. But your children have truly been troopers. We are all now in a position to focus on the future. We are at home at our permanent site and can get down to the business of educating our students.

In Academics we have collected a team of teachers that will inspire, teach and help your children. Returning and newly hired teachers will be on campus in mid-August to start planning and preparing for the upcoming school year. Thanks to some generous auction donors, some teachers will have new furniture and tools.

Socially, we will be more selective about student clubs and activities. We want these programs to reflect a more civil and considerate attitude towards the world around our kids. I would like to see the students perform more community service offsite and would like to see them start to delve into their wider South Bay Community. I believe all these things will help students appreciate what their parents and guardians have provided for them here at RHP.

Creatively, we will continue to offer a number of opportunities for self-expression, such as theater, dance, music, art, photography and even – in the sixth grade – horticulture! The parent association offers a writing contest and students can have a crack at publishing opportunities with the *Muse*, the *Crown Jewels* and the Yearbook. The Art Department faculty will keep students notified about contests and competitions in the community and nationally, and will encourage participation in these events.

Coach Knigin is taking over the entire RHP Athletic Department. The department will continue to offer a number of organized sports, but will also be doing a little reorganizing. Coach Cloer is now heading up the P.E. Department and this summer we are planning to reexamine P.E. and see if we can't present a more challenging curriculum. And as you can see from all of the activity on campus, we are constantly working on improving our fields and open areas to promote physical activity.

In general, I hope to bring everyone home to focus on the reasons we send our students to a private school. Private education should be safe, healthy and fun, as well as educationally rewarding. I am looking forward to the challenge of providing the kind of environment that makes students and parents proud to be a part of such a diverse and dynamic community. There is much to do this year and we welcome your support!

Renaissance School Year Three

The third year of the Renaissance School for Arts and Sciences was truly a remarkable year. The focus on developing community and building self esteem through academic competence flourished.

The Renaissance School and Rolling Hills Prep School communities continued to bond and forge relationships as students and teachers of both schools became accustomed to classes at the interim site. Students participated as one student body in morning meetings, club participation, the 8th grade play, middle school student council, physical education (including our circus program), interscholastic sports teams and outdoor education trips to CIMI, Astrocamp and canoeing down the Colorado River. Renaissance parents Tricia Courtney, Gail Fleury, and Cindy Horist attended joint school GAP (Grade Advisory Parent) meetings, planning events and distributing pizza during lunch on Mondays. The bond between the schools continued to grow and develop as we moved to our new permanent site and were finally on our own school grounds in our beautiful brand new classrooms.

In the arts, the discipline of yoga was continued on a weekly basis, as was movement, visual arts, drama, and photography. Students created works in three dimensional multi-media, charcoal, pastels, and water colors. The students staged a demonstration of their performing arts curriculum in December which featured their dance work with instructor Cindy Bradley of San Pedro City Ballet. The year ended with an all school production of Peter Pan, under the guidance of director Sandy Bradley, and assistant student 8th grade director, Meagan McKay. The fifth through seventh grade actors were supported by the eighth grade students who managed costumes, props, set design, lights, sound, and special effects. Performing on the stage of the Warner Grand Theater was an exciting experience and, overall, the play was a resounding success.

Academically, Renaissance students continued developing their writing, reading, math, and research skills through individualized and small group instruction as well as group projects. Amy Stewart-Johnston joined the Renaissance staff this year and brought with her a wealth of expertise in both academics and arts. Assisted by Casey Bradford, Amy saw to it that all students flourished when under her direction whether she was teaching reading, math, literature, and history or mentoring the

eighth grade internship projects. Casey Bradford continued to teach science, math, music, and reading, as well as assisting in the classroom.

The school year culminated with closing ceremonies which began with an introduction by Peter McCormack followed by a keynote address from the Renaissance school's founder, Dr. Susan McNary. Students then performed musical numbers, read their poetry, and the graduating eighth graders presented their internship projects. The ceremony included a delicious catered lunch. Each student received a gift and the eighth grade graduates received their certificates.

A cornerstone of the school's success continues to be our associate director, Wendy Moffat. Many of the events and activities we participated in throughout the year would not have been possible without her arduous efforts, foresight, and attention to detail. Wendy has been instrumental in assisting in the running of the school and in taking care of all of our admissions needs.

The Renaissance School is looking forward to an exciting 2007-2008 school year. Besides introducing a combination fourth and fifth grade class and a ninth grade program, we will be relocating our classrooms to a more centralized location on campus.

We look forward to a great year and we thank all of those responsible for the success of this past year. I especially want to thank Susan McNary and Bill Johnson, the Board of Rolling Hills Prep School for their unwavering support and enthusiasm, and of course our Renaissance School for Arts and Sciences families who make our school such a magical place to be. 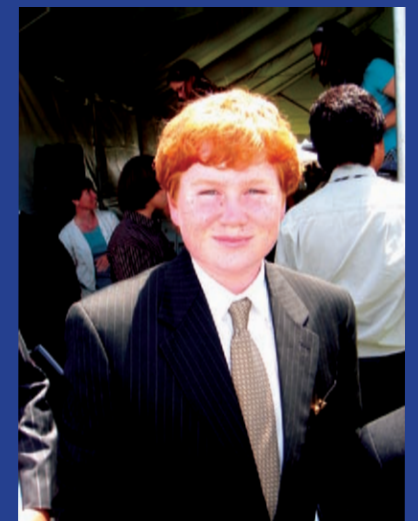

How Tuition and Fundraising Dollars are Spent

Our Annual Fund helps to close the gap between tuition and how much it actually costs to educate each student, as well as providing the many extras that basic tuition does not cover. And our Capital Fund, of course, focuses on our permanent campus and the different phases of completion.

As indicated on the following page, our annual operating budget (excluding capital campaign) of approximately \$6 million is 76% supported by tuition, 15% by other fees such as After School Program, Facility Fees, ESL, RTE, USAS, Athletics Fees and Outdoor Education fees, 6% by Annual Fundraising efforts, including events such as the Auctions and Golf Tournament, and 2% from other miscellaneous sources. In terms of how we spend those precious dollars, 68% goes to our most vital resource, salaries and benefits of the people who provide the education, 17% to financial aid, 8% to facilities costs, 7% to professional services and communications, 4% to depreciation, supplies, software and textbooks, and 2% to insurance and utilities.

On the capital side, all our dollars have gone towards Completing Phase I of our permanent home. When the project is completed, its total cost will be approximately \$15.5 million, with \$8.5 having come from Capital Campaign donations and \$7 million from a Bank of America loan. This debt, of course, generates mortgage payments to replace the lease payments we have been paying at Malaga Cove, hence the ongoing facility fees charged to every family every year. In this respect it is a fact that every single family who has attended our schools for the past ten years, as well as each one attending in the future, has contributed to building our campus.

The ongoing financial health of our schools is absolutely vital in order to ensure that we continue to serve our present and future students as well as we have served past students. Therefore, it is with immense gratitude that, on behalf of these students, I thank you all for your generous support during the 2006-07 school year.

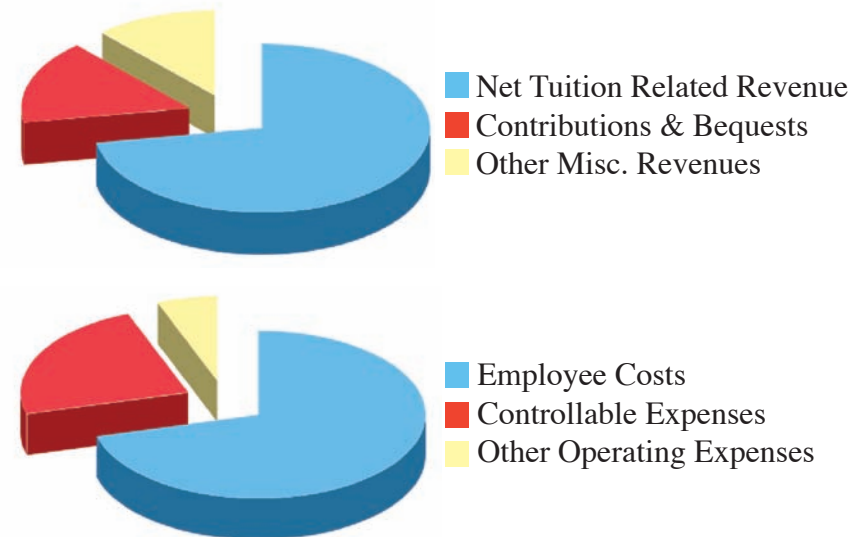

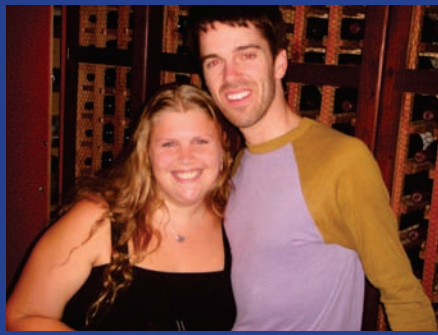
