"RAISING CHILDREN TO LOVE LEARNING"

How do parents instill a lifelong love of learning in their children? Deborah J. Stipek, Dean of the School of Education at Stanford, draws from current research to share both the obvious and subtle ways that parents can



at Stanford, draws from current research to share both the obvious and subtle ways that parents can maintain their children's enthusiasm for learning while helping them succeed academically. She gives useful suggestions for building children's self-confidence, engaging their curiosity and intrinsic interest, and developing a sense of personal responsibility and pride in their achievements. Co-author of *Motivated Minds: Raising Children to Love Learning* (Henry Holt), Stipek also suggests ways to protect children from the pressure so prevalent in schools today.

Dean Deborah J. Stipek joined the Stanford University School of Education as Dean and Professor of Education in January 2001. Dr. Stipek's scholarship concerns instructional effects on children's achievement motivation, early childhood education, elementary education and school reform. In addition, Dr. Stipek advises education policy makers at the national and local levels.

Lauren is currently an intern at the EPA's Pacific Southwest Regional Office, Air Division, in San Francisco. Lauren hails from the Los Angeles area and has spent the last few summers working at the Coalition for Clean Air in Los Angeles. She will spend Winter Quarter at Stanford-in-Washington focusing on Environmental and Health Policy. As a junior majoring in Earth Systems, Lauren feels "that working for the EPA will provide necessary experience and confidence to help me narrow my focus while in school, and when I leave Stanford." She explains that the only way to work with the EPA and handle environmental issues specific to California is to work at EPA's office in San Francisco.

MESA is a non-profit academic enrichment program designed to give awareness of math, science and engineering fields to high school and middle school students. 
Well-Kept Secrets of the San Fernando Valley
