- Others have spoken with Lili Miura and Stephen Smoke to explore the possibility of working with MS Custom Books on the project.

# October Speaker

In October, members enjoyed hearing Ruth Herbert, author, teacher and life story instructor, speak on "Getting Started with your Memoirs."

Ruth suggested as a guiding theme: "What is it like to be you?"

She stated that writing one's life story calms the past and acts as a memory trigger. Sharing helps open a dialogue, potentially a therapeutic activity for all involved.

To the question, "How much truth do you tell?" Ruth answered, "Your truth is your truth; it's your choice. If negative, you may not choose to tell it. If you do, be as gracious and as honest as you can."

Members and guests suggested presenting one's story as historical fiction or creative non-fiction as a way of addressing the issue.
