# ABOUT THE POSITION OF POET LAUREATE

# What is a Poet Laureate? What are the duties?

The Poet Laureate Consultant in Poetry to the Library of Congress (more commonly known as Poet Laureate of the United States) promotes a greater appreciation of poetry by overseeing an ongoing series of poetry readings and lectures at the Library. The Laureate gives an annual lecture and reading of his or her poetry and usually introduces poets in the Library's poetry series, the oldest in the Washington area and among the oldest in the United States. This annual series of public poetry and fiction readings, lectures, symposia, and occasional dramatic performances began in the 1940s. Collectively the Laureates have brought more than 2,000 poets and authors to the Library to read for the Archive of Recorded Poetry and Literature.

Each consultant has emphasized a different literary focus --creating poetry workshops for women at the Library of Congress, providing poetry in airports, supermarkets and hotel rooms, exploring the African diaspora through the eyes of its artists, organizing a conference of noted novelists, poets and storytellers who discussed writing, nature and community. Often the focus has been youth --meeting with elementary school students to encourage them to write poetry, founding an international children's poetry and art contest, and initiating the Favorite Poem Project.

## How is a Poet Laureate chosen?

The Poet Laureate is appointed annually by the Librarian of Congress and serves from October to May. In making the appointment, the Librarian consults with former appointees, the current Laureate and distinguished poetry critics. The position has existed under two separate titles: from 1937 to 1986 as "Consultant in Poetry to the Library of Congress" and from 1986 forward as "Poet Laureate Consultant in Poetry." The name was changed by an act of Congress in 1985. The Laureate receives a \$35,000 annual stipend funded by a gift from Archer M. Huntington.

## How and when was the position created?

The U.S. position was modeled on that of the Poet Laureate of England. In 1936, Archer M. Huntington created an endowment which established an annual stipend for a Consultant in Poetry to the Library of Congress. In 1937, the Library appointed its first Consultant, Joseph Auslander, who served until 1941.

# Who is the current Poet Laureate of the United States?

On June 17, 2008, the Library of Congress announced **Kay Ryan** as the country's sixteenth Poet Laureate.

# Other Poets Laureate

**United Kingdom** - In the United Kingdom, the term has for centuries been the title of the official poet of the monarch, appointed for life since the time of Charles II. **Andrew Motion** is the present Poet Laureate of Great Britain. There is also a Children's Laureate.

**California** - California was the first state to establish the position of Poet Laureate, with the appointment of Ina Donna Coolbrith in 1915. Initially, it was an unofficial position, conferred as a lifetime appointment. Since that time, five persons have held the honorary title of Poet Laureate. In 2001, Governor Gray Davis signed Assembly Bill 113, which established the official position. State Poets Laureate are now appointed by the Governor for a two-year term. California's current Laureate, **Carol Muske-Dukes**, was appointed November 13, 2008.
